The incoming government is likely to have to contend with a billion-dollar hole in its books, as the fourth and final auction of units under the Emissions Trading Scheme (ETS) for the year isn't expected to clear on December 6.

While this would be inconvenient for the new government, ETS experts say a failed auction wouldn't be a "failure".

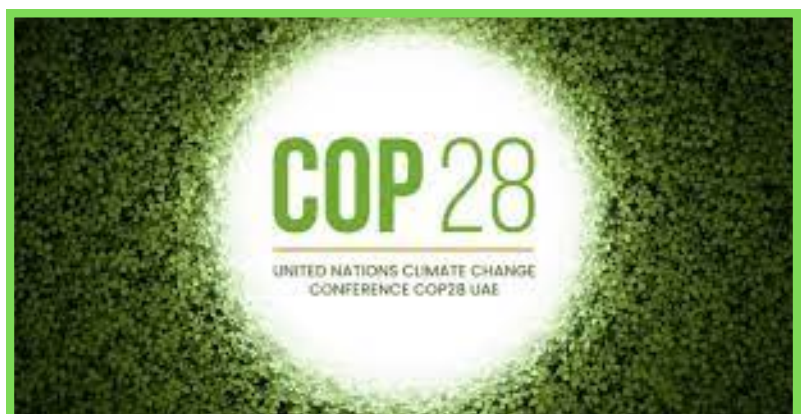
Jarden's head of commodities Nigel Brunel said the best thing would be for the December auction to fail to give the market an opportunity to right itself.

Tightening the supply of units a little would put upward pressure on the price, better incentivising emissions reductions.
